 - 6) The FCFC will compile data of time frames to report on the timeliness of service coordination and delivery of services

Although we do not have specific data on this, the service coordination process has allowed several families to maintain the children in the home or at least delay the removal from the home. One family told me that without the respite we were able to provide, they couldn't have kept their child in the home for as long as they did.
