Ohio Family and Children First, Youth and Young Adults in Transition Steering Committee

The purpose of Ohio Family and Children First is to help families seeking government services by streamlining and coordinating services, resources, and systems.

The Ohio Family and Children First (OFCF) Cabinet Council formed the Youth and Young Adults in Transition (YYAT) Steering Committee in 2009 and young adults who may be impacted or in need of any governmental system or service. The purpose of the Steering Committee is to align and consolidate policies, efforts, and resources; and identify major gaps for this particularly vulnerable and often overlooked population. The target population is youth and young adults, ages 14 to 25 with emphasis on those most vulnerable. The YYAT Steering Committee, representing youth, thirteen state agencies, providers, associations, and key external stakeholders created a strategic plan and began implementing it in 2010.

Based on the work from the OFCF YYAT Steering Committee, Ohio is well-situated to improve the coordination of services, resources, and policies so to become more effective and efficient in meeting the needs of youth and young adults in transition.
