



Strategies

Funding has been a barrier to addressing the priorities in addition to building capacity among some of the systems. There has been a constant turnover this past year with a number of transitions in various positions, including FCFC Director.

2. Identify any successes/how implementing this plan has worked to strengthen the council and county collaboration.

The System of Care partners are restructuring to enhance its Service Coordination Mechanism. We have been working on increasing training and knowledge of High-Fidelity Wraparound. We are also reviewing policies to better use funding sources such as ODM's MSY funds in order to identify in-home supports and reduce out of home placements.

4. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):

Having minimal staff and funding to do high fidelity wraparound has been a challenge. Getting community members educated/trained on high-fidelity wraparound and System of Care processes has been slow. The Wraparound Coordinator is continuing to attend Wraparound learning communities and trainings. The counties System of Care partners are working on restructuring and will be reviewing the Service Coordination Mechanism to align with the County’s partnership principles. The county continues to use out of home placements, however, is identifying and utilizing in-home supports.

With staff turnover, it has been difficult to track all cases back to the beginning of SFY19. Numbers provided may not encompass all data due to missing data for youth served.
