


# Greene County Family and Children First Council Shared Plan Update for SFYs 17-19

Greene County FCFC will operate efficiently and effectively. The Priority was unchanged however the Shared Measurement of Active Youth Move chapters in each school district will be modified to reflect one chapter of youth move in Greene County with representation sought from each school district. Priorities

Greene County FCFC has an active Youth Move chapter with representation from five school districts at this time. Outcomes

Number of school districts with active representation in Youth Move. Indicators

Greene County FCFC conducted an art contest in each of the school districts to introduce the concept of Youth Move. The Director has spoken at the Superintendents Meeting. Staff have spoken with administrators and existing youth leadership groups in the schools to recruit input and involvement. Strategies

1. Identify any barriers in implementing the plan (i.e. data collection, data tracking, funding, infrastructure, etc.)  
Parent involvement continues to be a difficult barrier. Three parents were identified for involvement in FCFC, but two have professional jobs that prohibit them from attending meetings on a regular basis. They receive all FCFC communication by email and are kept informed of all FCFC business, however attendance at Council meetings has been an issue. FCFC is working with various system providers, including the Mental Health and Recovery Board to identify parents who are able to attend meetings and thus take a more active role in council business.
  
2. Identify any successes/how implementing this plan has worked to strengthen the council and county collaboration.  
Collaborations between Greene County Family and Children First and community providers have improved over the last year. There has been a conscientious effort in Greene County to form collaborative partnerships in order to address complex issues in the community, such as the opiate crisis. Family and Children First has representation on several collaboratives, including the Greene County Drug Prevention Coalition, United Way, Suicide Prevention Coalition, Community Action Program(CAP) Advisory Board, several early childhood initiatives, several collaborations addressing prevention in the community which have been initiated by the Mental Health and Recovery Board and several collaborations with local school districts.  
One area FCFC has been very successful in this past year, and the outcomes demonstrate, is the focus and utilization of High Fidelity Wraparound services to address family issues within the community and prevent the need for out of home placements. High Fidelity Wraparound, which is collaborative in nature, has been successful utilizing family strengths and identifying creative solutions to family problems. In turn the number of out of home placements for youth involved in High Fidelity Wraparound, were significantly reduced in the last year.

There is still significant room for improvement in this area and currently efforts are under way with other system providers, such as the Mental Health and Recovery Board and school systems to identify parents who are interested in serving as parent representatives and available to attend quarterly council meetings.

**6. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):**

Youth Move has consistently had participation from five different school districts, averaging five members over the course of the year. However, due to the transient nature of this population of at risk youth, several members have left, while others joined. There has been a significant focus on recruitment by the FCF Prevention Staff and contact has been made with local 4H chapters, Central State University and each of the schools with youth led programs, to identify more youth for the program. One of the youth who moved from Greene County, did remain involved on the State Youth Move Board, thus a lasting connection was made for this youth.

Shared Outcome: **Decrease in the number of out of home placements for youth involved in High Fidelity Wraparound and more specifically a reduction of the youth placed in residential facilities.**

8. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):

There has been a significant reduction in the number of out of home placements, while the number of youth served has remained relatively unchanged. This can be attributed to the staff at FCFC becoming more comfortable in the process, after utilizing it another year and also having greater buy in from community providers to the process. Several outside providers have been trained in the process of High Fidelity Wraparound, including staff from Juvenile Court that Greene County FCFC secured funding for their training. This has helped with consistency in the process with all team members working towards the same goal.
