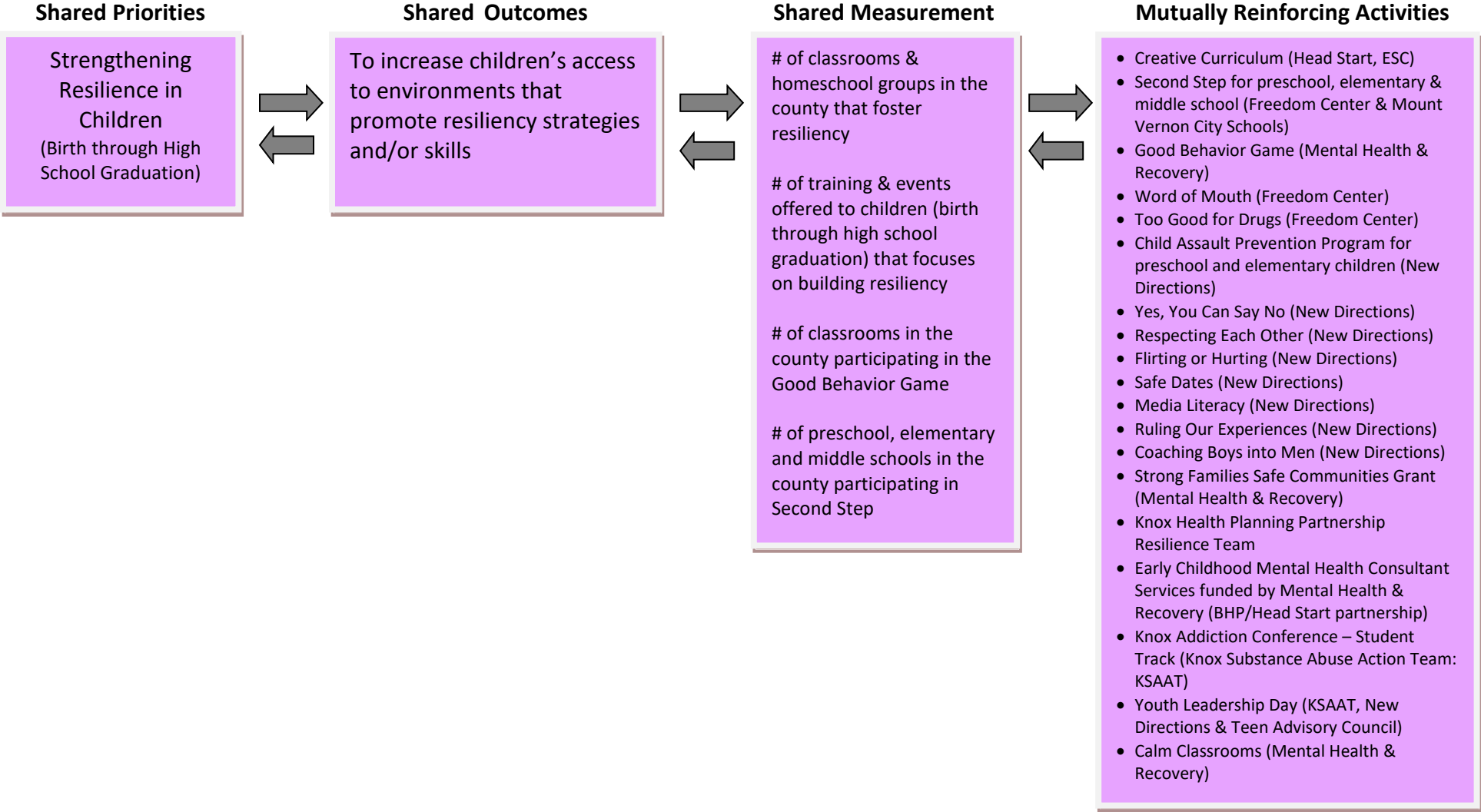
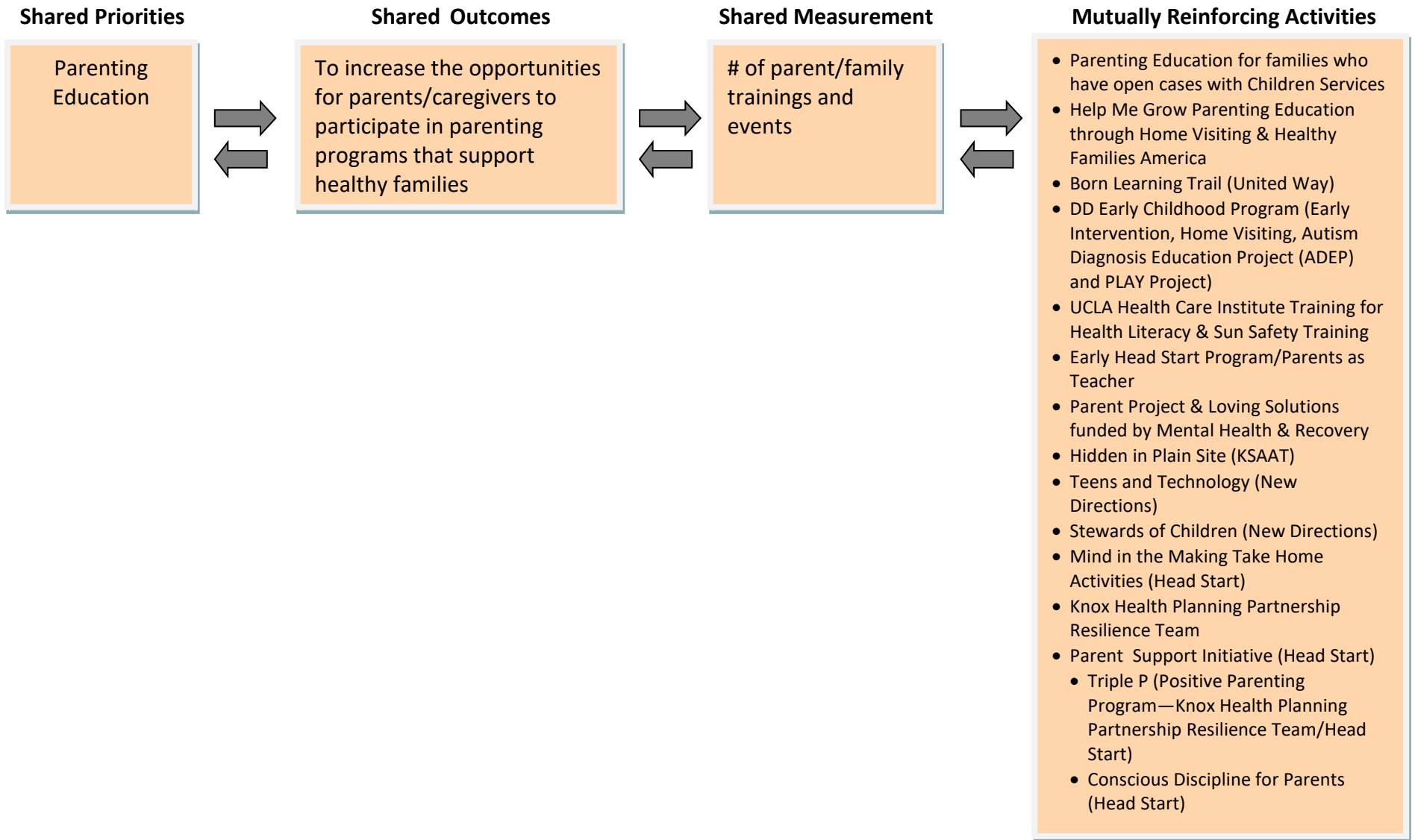
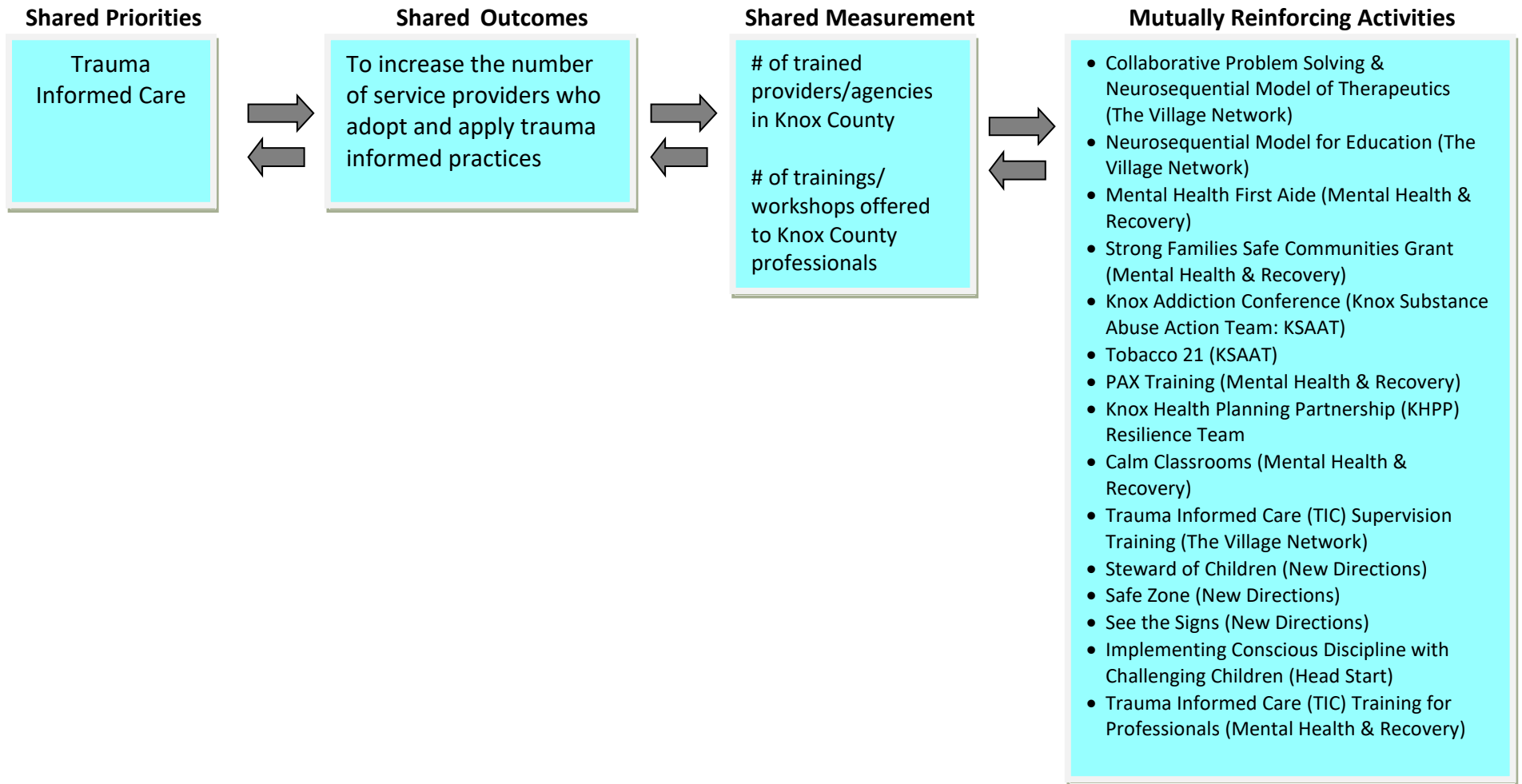

- Knox County Planning Partnership (KCPP) Resilience Team - 11 viewings with discussion of the film Resilience.
- New Directions – Stewards of Children: training for 6 Kenyon College student volunteers and 19 students in Knox County Career Center early childhood classes. Safe Zone (LGBTQ+ 101): training for 22 community members and 25 students in the Knox County Career Center Nursing program. See the Signs (Domestic Violence 101): training for 15 community members and 25 students in the Knox County Career Center early childhood classes.
- Freedom Center – 1 training was provided to 18 Knox County teachers in the Good Behavior Game funded through Mental Health & Recovery levy dollars
- Trauma Informed Care (TIC) Supervision Training – 7 trainings with 94 individuals trained.
- Six R's Training – 8 trainings with 121 individuals trained.
- Head Start – offered 3 two-hour trainings on Trauma informed care that utilized the Conscious Discipline Resources to 58 direct service employees (including family advocates, teachers, assistant teachers and home educators).
- Mental Health & Recovery – Mental Health First Aid Adult Signs & Symptoms Training offered 4 trainings for 61 community members.
