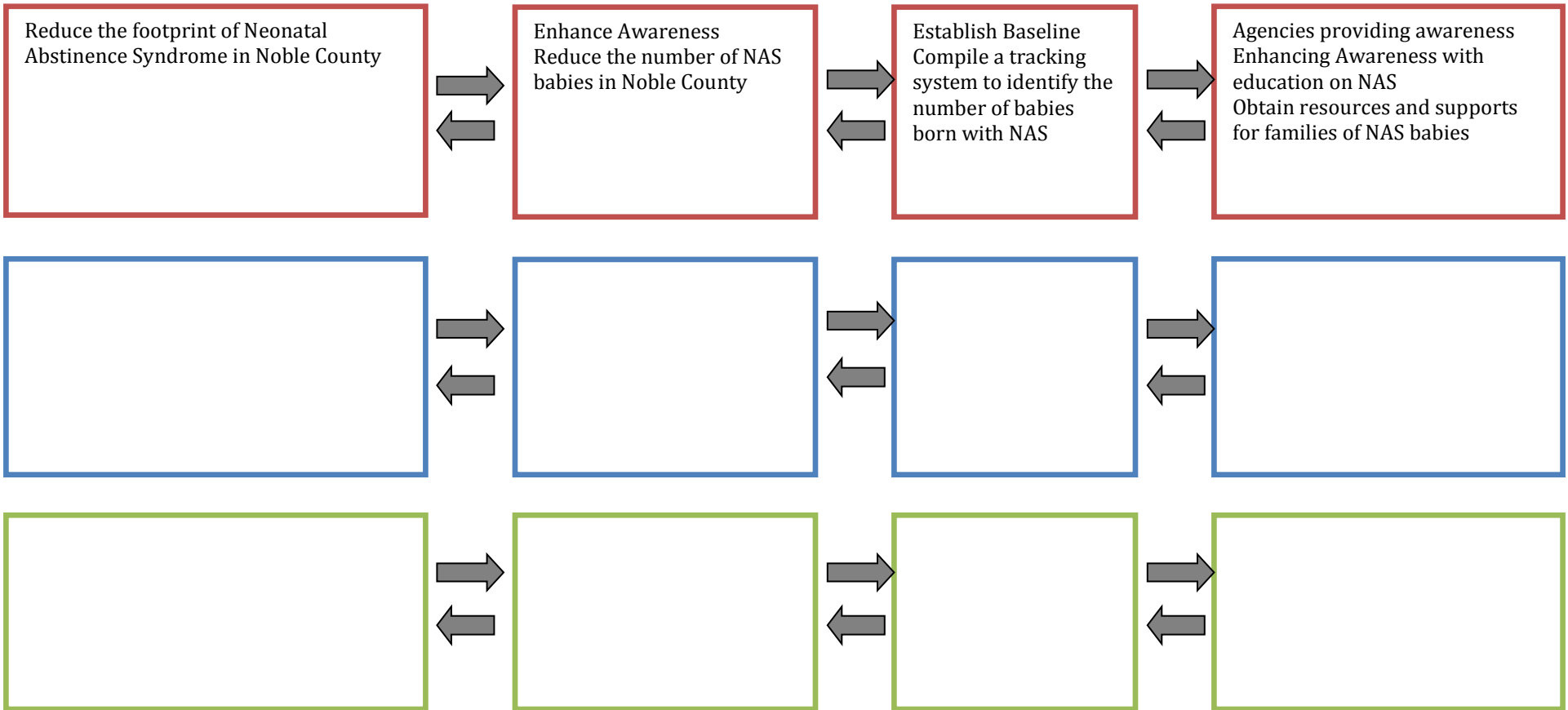

Strategies

1. Identify any barriers in implementing the plan (i.e. data collection, data tracking, funding, infrastructure, etc.)

We have not formally designed any data tracking forms. We have discussed NAS issues frequently at our FCFC Council meetings and at Cluster meetings. The Noble County Health Dept. now includes information about taking drugs, of any kind, while pregnant, with each positive pregnancy test that they give, when a woman comes to their agency requesting a pregnancy test. The Noble County Health Dept. also sponsored a Community Baby Shower, which included several community sponsors, in April 2017. Melissa Fitzgerald of Noble Behavior Health Services gave a presentation on drug use during pregnancy.

2. Identify any successes/how implementing this plan has worked to strengthen the council and county collaboration.

After Council began this process, more information was also discussed about the severe drug addiction problem in Noble County.

FCFC Council has been instrumental in beginning a community drug coalition team. We have held meetings every month since December and the group, which includes all of FCFC Council and multiple community members. Some of those representatives include: Noble County Sheriff's Office, Noble County Chamber, United Ambulance, Noble Correctional Institute (NCI), Noble Family Violence Council, The Journal Leader, OSU Extension, United Way and Belle Valley Fire Dept. First Responders. This Coalition is working on developing a brochure that will be available in our community with information/resources that any individuals can contact for help. These brochures will be available at all Council agencies and multiple business within our county. Both school districts are collaborating to develop teaching/awareness about drugs in all elementary grades and hopefully develop "Drug Free Clubs" in each of the two high schools; OSU Extension and the Noble County Health Dept. are also involved in this project. Implementation is scheduled to begin with the 2017=2018 school year. Plans are also in progress to have a float in our community Firemen's Festival parade on Thursday and Saturday nights, July 27th and 29th, with information handed out about "Start Talking", CRISIS Text Line, and Noble County CARES brochures with the contact information for help with addiction. We are just in the beginning stages, but good things have evolved since we began this NAS project!

The Noble County Health Dept. changed the information that is discussed with each woman who has a positive pregnancy test to include information about drug use during pregnancy and provides referral information of resources available for them to go for help.
